RARA placed 21st out of 127 entries in the 4A category. We had a total of 1436 contacts and 5196 total points including bonus points. Most importantly, we learned about operating under portable conditions and had a great time doing it.

The ARRL has continued to protect and advance our privileges and it appears other radio spectrum users are becoming increasingly concerned with the effects of BPL, and have voiced their opinions with the FCC.

This year we moved the 147.000 and the 223.880 repeaters to the new location at St Anthony Hospital. This was done through the help of many people, and our thanks to them is extended.

Speaking of people, I can think of a few times where ham radio has played an important part in a decision I have made in life, or has helped solve a situation encountered.
