#### From the desk of the Vice President...

I have discovered a digital HF mode called PSK31. It has been around since 1999, and is popular and gaining momentum. This mode is about 31.25 baud, and 33 Hz wide in band width. PSK31 does a very good job with both noisy conditions, and weak signals. Having said this, it is keyboard-to-keyboard exchange, needing a computer, software, and a sound card interface. MFJ makes several nice interfaces that also come with some software. The April issue of QST also has plans on how to homebrew your own interface if you like. You can also download some software off the Internet; some for free, and some you pay to register after a free trial period. Ham Radio Deluxe http://hrd.ham-radio.ch is for free and mainly is for controlling radios but also includes PSK31, mapping, satellite help, logging, and a SWL program. Then there is MixW (a pay to register (\$50.00) but is worth every cent. This is a whopper of a program, containing, PSK31, RTTY, CW, AMTOR, Packet, SSTV, Hell, FAX, and other modes. MixW also has a nice logging program, and is user friendly. Another program is DIGIPAN, and this freeware. Don't know much, but I have heard good things about this program, and the price is right (FREE). Of course Digipan can be found at (www.digipan.net). I have been on PSK31, since only early February, and not even half trying, I have already got Mexico, Cuba, Botswana Africa, Puerto Rico, Argentina, and Netherlands Antiles.

Saturday, March 19<sup>th</sup>, we had yet another weather spotting class at the Rockford Airport, and it was a very good presentation. Had some minor updates, and informed us about a few new improvements to the RADAR system, and their new flood campaign. **Gene WB9MMM** passed out our ARES badges, and they looked great. Also **Sue KA9GNR** out did herself with an organized approach to using a card for weather spotters to use, and for those in charge to quickly verify that they are indeed a certified spotter. **Moe**, **N9CCE** and **Wayne**, **KA9IMX** designed the card. Hope we have another great year.

Also, I would like to try adding a small lighthearted segment to the Friday night meetings. It would be called "Ham Radio Freestyle." This would be right after the business portion of the meeting, but just before intermission and snacks. This is a chance for the "'Ol-Timers" to tell a humorous anecdote (funny personal story) of an incident past (one funny now, but not then) or a mistake. A chance for all to relive and laugh. But this also would be an opportunity for some of the new hams to ask a question concerning a problem they ran into (i.e. High SWR etc.), or perhaps what something is / how do I use it? (i.e. what is an IF filter?) I'm sure someone knows the answer, and would gladly help a newer ham. So I hope you come prepared to tell a story, ask a question, or to laugh at a great story (Like about the guy on field day sending CW in his sleep.) Let's all go to RARA and have a few HAHAs!

<u>Did you know</u> that you can actually see the International Space Station (ISS) when conditions are right? Well you can if you know where to look in the sky and when

Go to website http://spaceflight1.nasa.gov/realdata This NASA site brings up several options but the main ones are "sighting opportunities" and "Orbital tracking". Click on "sighting opportunities" and then scroll down to the city you are in, click on the city and it will give you a sheet with the date, time, how long it is visible (usually only a couple of minutes), angles of approach and departure and the maximum elevation.

(Currently just for the ISS). As long as the sky is clear, it will show up exactly where the list says and appear like a bright moving star.

If you click on "Orbital tracking", this will bring up a screen that will show you where the ISS is and what its paths will be for the next two passes around the world. It also lists speed, altitude and other information. The ISS has a packet station aboard and it is possible to hear the transmissions if you listen on 145.805.

When the space shuttle is launched, at end of May, this same program will allow you to see where it is as well.
