#### Russian Arctic Expedition, Rare DX Possibilities!

Feb. 28 2007 Russian Arctic Expedition will start from Moscow.

The most difficult and challenging part of the "Polar Ring" expedition program (2002-2009) – crossing of Arctic Ocean over the North Pole will hold in February-June, 2007. Several unique cross-country vehicles on extra-low pressure tires will pass more that two thousand kilometers of drifting and hummocked ice floes as well as wide open stretches of water. In case of success, the expedition will become the first trans-arctic crossing and first round-the-world Arctic journey, accomplished by overland cross-country vehicles. An extensive scientific program has been carrying out during the expedition, including physiological, meteorological, glaciological, hydrological and environmental explorations. The trekking team will operate in HF HAM radio bands under R3CA/0, R3CA/0/m, and VY0/R3CA call-signs from the route. Aims and goals of that expedition program, as well as its detail description can be found in www.ec-arctic.ru/PolarRingAnn.pdf

HF/VHF radio (both commercial and amateur) remains one of the most important mean of communication used in the "Polar Ring". Currently we are supplied by this equipment only partly: IC-7000 (reserve HF/VHF gear), handhelds IC-V82, and mobiles IC-V8000.

In the same time, the "Polar Ring" project includes the North Pole HAM radio DXpedition in April 15-30, 2007. It will operate from the drifting ice base "Borneo" near the Pole point. Not only a common HF activity but also a unique, first in the history Earth-Moon-Earth (EME) VHF/UHF operation from drifting ice is planned.
