SWR meters - What Good Are They?

When is the last time you used your SWR meter to help install a new antenna?

Chuck, AB9KA, will show and tell us how to use the SWR bridge when you are building a new antenna and how it tells you if your antenna is to long or too short. It is planned that he will show, using a graph on the white board, how to determine what you need to do to the antenna depending on what main frequency range you want to use. - 1. The ATV meeting was held with election of officers, President John Auerswald, KA9SOG, Vice President – Dan Hunt, KC9ATR, Secretary/Treasurer – Gene Harlan, WB9MMM. In addition to election of officers, they updated the 1.2 Ghz transmitter/receiver boards. The ATV repeater is currently broadcasting NASA TV 24 hrs a day and they have a camera pointed at the corner of State St and Mulford during station ID time.
- 2. Awards from last year were handed out to Kurt Eversole, KE9NJ, on last years board of directors and Joe Perry, K9JPP, field day chairman last year. Neither was able to attend the awards banquet.

New Buisiness:

BREAKING DX NEWS: SPRATLY ISLANDS COMING ON THE AIR

If you have waited a ham radio lifetime to work the very elusive Spratly Islands, wait no longer. This with word that Ed Sawyer N1UR and his wife Christine, KB1PQN are expected to be active portable 9M6 from the Layang-Layang Island Resort in the SpraI-Islands. This, between 0800 UTC on , March 22nd through midnight UTC on March 30th.

The duo have already received their licenses. Once they get permission from the Navy, they will apply for a special 9M0 callsign. Activity will be on 160 through 10 meters, on CW and SSB. 100 watts to omnidirectional verticals will be used from the near-by beach and the operators will be moving bands frequently to take advantage of changing band conditions and openings. Sunset on Spratly is 1040 UTC with sunrise at 2240 by the middle of that week.
