NEW 146.610 REPEATER INSTALLED

After evaluation of the old 146.610 repeater by Chuck Ingle, AB9KA, and Don Russell, W9DRR, it was determined that a new repeater was the best solution to resolve the ongoing problems with the current repeater in place, which has been in service for over 20 years. Presenting the RARA Board with the costs involved on November 13th, it was voted and approved to purchase a Vertex Standard VXR-9000 Repeater. Installed by Don Russell, W9DRR, and Gordon Seaman, KC9NEX on Monday, November 23rd, the repeater has solved the problems plagued by the old repeater and has provided increased range and sensitivity, as well as many new features not found on the old repeater. Your nominee should be chosen using two basic criteria: The nominee must be a RARA member, and should have preformed exemplary service for amateur radio during the year 2009.



Revisiting the Power of the dB

Engineers use the dB to describe ratios of power: accordingly, we should from time to time refresh ourselves on the meanings and uses of dB. $Log_B N = P$ is the same information written rewritten as $B^P = N$. For example, $Log_5 12 = 1.544$, and $5^{1.544} = 12$.

dBs in power (I^2Z) means dB = 10 log₁₀ (P^2/P_1). For antennas, the dB should indicate if the standard is the base power of an isotropic radiator (radiates as if it was at the center of, and was illuminating the inside of, a sphere), or a dipole. If we use an isotropic radiator, measurements are from 0 (dB_i), with the dipole standard having 2.14 dB more of concentrated power (dB_d). A dB_i of the same power ratio will be a number +2.14 higher than a dB_d.

dBs are convenient as we can add or subtract dBs directly. dBs are logarithmic and adding or subtracting achieves the same result as multiplying or dividing powers. A half-power point on an antenna far field elevation plot is at -3dB. (dB = log10 $\frac{1}{2}$).

dBs are used to determine how much power is required for communication between two places on Earth. For example, if a Ham in Rockford wants to work a Ham in Spain, and his propagation program shows 35 dB_d of path energy is required for a QSO at a given date and time, the sum of the transmitter and antenna gain expressed in dBs, plus the receiving antenna gain expressed in dBs, must exceed 35 dBs. How much excess is required depends upon the noise conditions (signal to noise ratios).

For voltage and current the dB is calculated with $dB = 20 \text{ Log}_{10} (V_2/V_1)$. A typical table of amplification and the approximate magnitude of response follows:

Typical Values	
Amplification	Magnitude of Response
1	0 dB
$\sqrt{2}$	$\approx +3 \text{ dB}$
1/√2	$\approx -3 dB$
2	≈+ 6dB
4	≈+ 12 dB
10	+ 20 dB
0.1	- 20 dB

So, the next time you hear dBs mentioned you will know exactly what is being discussed.

ARRL is pleased to announce the availability of a new suite of Amateur Radio mobile software -- designed specifically for use with the Apple's iPhone and iPod Touch. The applications -- or

"apps" -- are named <u>ARRL Technician</u>, <u>ARRL General</u> and <u>ARRL Extra</u> and function as an electronic version of practice exam flash cards.

Amateur Radio exam candidates can use the applications as a study companion to the <u>ARRL license manuals</u> and classroom instruction. The apps include all the possible questions and answers that will be on each of the license tests. Users can flag questions that need more review, segment questions for study by sub-element, or even study the questions in a random order.

The ARRL apps are produced and sold by McSnyder Software who has partnered with ARRL to provide the iPhone app series. McSnyder has also produced study applications for other organizations -- including exam preparation software for standardized educational testing in Texas, as well as US Citizenship immigration testing. "We are excited to introduce Amateur Radio and ARRL into the rapidly expanding mobile and portable technology arena," said ARRL Marketing Manager Bob Inderbitzen, NQ1R. "Not only do these applications demonstrate ARRL's commitment to users of these popular devices, the software helps promote Amateur Radio outside of our traditional publication channels." FREE HAM RADIO WEBINARS


