Club Service Project

We have a unique opportunity to get exposure to our club. Midway Village Museum in Rockford has asked if we could construct an antique working telegraph system at their sight, It would need to be authentic looking and sounding. Boundary conditions are that we have no budget from either RARA or Midway village. We would be able however to have numerous opportunities for community contact. I think that we could get them to permanently display the origin of the project.

We would need donated 2 keys and sounders from the railroad era (ca. 1900). There could be some latitude, but the design would have to be from that era. We could construct things like sound amplifiers for the sounders, but they would need to be authentic. We would also have to build period battery boxes to hide the power supply (Wet batteries would be too dangerous) While the use of American Morse code would be nice, the only one who would recognize the difference would be an old Railroader.

The proposed sight of the two stations would be the General Store/Post Office, and the Bank. Fortunately there is a pole behind and in-between the two buildings at the rear. Wire could be run at an angle between the buildings on a single existing pole. The wire would need to be single strand.

We would have to figure out the least intrusive manner to enter the wires into the buildings. There is household current to power the supply, but the feed would have to be hidden,

We would like to take some time at a meeting to discuss this in detail. We have until May of 2013, and we are allowed access to the museum without visitors (probably before it opens next year). Please give this some thought. We would like to submit some questions to the museum staff to see what causes them "heartburn". Then we could work around our needs and their requirements.

After that Q&A we could submit a proposal, After the proposal is approved, there would be need for volunteers to construct and install the system. Once the system is completed and operational, there would be a need for operators to send and receive messages between the two stations. There would be a need for period clothing for the operators.

Right now, we would need photos, and questions. We would need volunteers to research the details so we could do a professional job.

This is an opportunity to make a permanent mark on the local history in Rockford with permanent recognition for the club.

An Important Act from the Illinois Legislature affecting Radio Amateurs

Public Act 097-0720

HB1390 Enrolled LRB097 07768 KMW 47880 b

AN ACT concerning local government.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Illinois Municipal Code is amended by adding Section 11-13-1.5 as follows:

(65 ILCS 5/11-13-1.5 new)

Sec. 11-13-1.5. **Amateur radio communications**; **antenna regulations**. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, no ordinance or resolution may be adopted or enforced by a municipality after the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 97th General Assembly that affects the placement,

screening, or height of antennas or antenna support structures that are used for amateur radio communications unless the ordinance or resolution: (i) has a reasonable and clearly defined aesthetic, public health, or safety objective and represents the minimum practical regulation that is necessary to accomplish the objectives; and (ii) reasonably accommodates amateur radio communications.

A municipality may not regulate the antennas or antenna support structures that are used for amateur radio communications in a manner inconsistent with this Section. This Section is a limitation under subsection (i) of Section 6 of Article VII of the Illinois Constitution on the concurrent exercise by home rule units of powers and functions exercised by the State.

Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon becoming law.

Secretary's Report – RARA Club Meeting July 13, 2012

The meeting was brought to order by President Tom Shouler, N9VJU at 7:07 PM. 17 people were in attendance. The first order of business was a reading of the Secretary's report from the June club meeting by acting secretary John Olson, W9JGO. A motion to accept the report as read was made by Doug Abrahamson, KC9SDO and seconded by Denny Johanson, K9VMJ. The report was accepted by a unanimous voice vote. Apparently I was not fast enough with a response, She had already contacted Robert Larson and made arrangements to drop the magazines at his home. John Olson mentioned the need for a club library, space to store library items and a club librarian. Again, no volunteer, except for possible storage space.

Tom Shouler stated that he was contacted by Ed Larson of Midway Village Museum asking for help in setting up two "Turn of Century" Telegraph Stations for use by next year's Chautauqua event. For the club. Denny Johanson provided some info on the only remaining functional B-29 WWII Bomber radio operation issues.

The K7RA Solar Report

Propagation Forecast Bulletin 31 ARLP031 From Tad Cook, K7RA Seattle, WA August 3, 2012 To all radio amateurs

Average daily sunspot numbers this week were up over 47 points to 99.3. Average daily solar flux rose nearly 35 points to 131.7.

Solar flux jumped from 139.8 on Tuesday, July 31 to 150.1 on Wednesday, August 1. Predicted solar flux is 135 on August 3-4, 130 on August 5-6, 125 on August 7-9, 130 on August 10-11, and 120 on August 12-13. Solar flux is expected to drop below 100 on August 16-21. Predicted planetary A index is 8 on August 3, 5 on August 4-19, 8 on August 20-21, 5 on August 22-23, then 8, 8, 12 and 8 on August 24-27.

At the beginning of August we have some new sunspot data from our 3-month moving average. The three-month moving averages centered on January through June 2012 are 83.3, 73.7, 71.2, 87.3, 91.5, and 96.5. The average centered on June 2012 is every daily sunspot number from May 1 through July 31 added together, then divided by the number of days, which is 92. You could say that this latest number is the 3-month trailing average, or the 3-month average centered on June. Every month we include a new month of data and drop off an old month.

F.K. Janda, OK1HH says to expect mostly quiet geomagnetic conditions on August 3-4, active to disturbed on August 5, quiet to unsettled August 6-7, mostly quiet August 8, quiet on August 9, active to disturbed again on August 10-11, quiet to active August 12-13, mostly quiet on August 14-15, and quiet to active on August 16-17.

On the NASA Solar Cycle Prediction page, the only thing that has changed over the past few months is the date. This is issued monthly: http://solarscience.msfc.nasa.gov/predict.shtml.

Sunspot numbers for July 26 through August 1 were 77, 91, 108, 79, 106, 116, and 118, with a mean of 99.3. 10.7 cm flux was 114.7, 123.3, 126.6, 131.4, 136, 139.8, and 150.1, with a mean of 131.7. Estimated planetary A indices were 4, 5, 11, 6, 13, 6, and 6, with a mean of 7.3. Estimated mid-latitude A indices were 3, 5, 11, 6, 11, 5, and 7 with a mean of 6.9.
